OPERATIONS UPDATES

Thank you to the donors and organizations who support our programs. We ask for your continuing support to the programs below that have benefitted our Veterans and First Responders. It has been a blessed year for Military Outreach USA (MOUSA). We remain mission-focused: changing lives, reducing suicides and providing long-term solutions.

Stand-by-me Heroes. This program focuses on reducing the dark number of 22+ suicides per day in our Veteran community. The Deep Dive Report of 2022, supported by Alabama and Duke Universities, details daily Veteran suicides as high as 40 per day. The Coroner's Association of America has redefined the definitions of suicide; Veteran organizations condemn the lie of

16 suicides per day. The Veterans Administration bureaucracy uses complex algebraic formulas to estimate suicides: They appear afraid of using whole numbers and common sense, but this is the DC environment. Common sense should be the rule, not academics. We also continue to focus on our First Responders, with their growing number of suicides per month. Our Foxhole Soul Counselors continue to speak 1:1 with anyone struggling and our partnerships with the regional VA hospitals and CBOCs remain strong in saving lives.

Veterans Exiting Homelessness Program helps community organizations gather Move-In-Essentials (necessary items when moving into an apartment). Jim Dunne and his team continue to bear fruit along with the support of UNITS in Mundelein IL. We place a 10'x15' storage box on site of the collection, help advertise the collection event, and then return the storage box to the UNITS warehouse where the items are divided among three local VAs, veteran retirement homes and other veterans in the community. NOTE: If you or your church, company, neighborhood, school or organization would like to participate, we have a defined process and team to help coordinate your event.

Moral Injury Research Dr. John P Bair has retired after 30 years as a VA research psychologist but continues to impact veterans with his team's research on Moral Injury. When a hero graduates from high school or college, joins military service and is in a combat situation (aka kill or be killed scenario), many lose their innocence and moral compass. We remain focused helping our military and first responders with recovery and restoration of **mind, body and soul**. Focus on this trifecta is key for success- impacting the whole person.

Town Hall and Training On the 4th Thursday of every month except December we hold informational discussions of important topics via Zoom. Our Town Hall is unafraid to tackle tough subjects and provide solutions that will impact our veterans and first responders. Too many organizations fail to focus on controversial subjects that can help our heroes. We cannot cover against bureaucrats and others attempting to diminish the sacrifices of our heroes and their families. We also provide training for the general public and for our Foxhole Soul Counselor (FSC) teams across the country - NCOs, officers, psychologists, nurses, everyday civilians who can learn a simple framework and help those who are struggling to avoid a fatal mistake. Academics is not the solution to help an estimated 21 million veterans. The Veterans Administration admits they do not have the resources to assist all veterans. We do make a difference.. **Email us if interested in intervening and saving lives of our nation's heroes.**

Veterans Community Center Initiative (VCC) We are partnering with Stand-by-My Heroes to help raise \$5M to help save lives as they look to convert a building in the West Suburbs of Chicago. This facility will house 20 female, 20 male and 10 veterans with children 24/7. The residents agree to attend all their VA medical appointments, training programs and help with job placement and support from the VA's HUD-VASH program. Within 12 months, the veteran will graduate, and another will fill that slot. Our trained staff will provide a non-judgmental atmosphere, with physical and spiritual support as part of the recovery and restoration process. CONTINUING EDUCATION: Foxhole Soul Counseling



Foxhole Soul Counselors (FSC) from our SBMH Chapters attend events and engage with anyone who asks for 1:1 Soul Counseling. Not only are those who lost comrades continuing to hurt, but we must not forget their families and friends.

We hear souls crying out for someone to 'Stand-by-me.' Our Foxhole Soul Counselors are there to speak with anyone suffering from a soul pain, moral injury or PTSD. Foxhole Soul Counselors focus on faith, not religion, to restore one's whole person and to walk with them as friend, as family.

These men and women, intervening for others, are making a difference resulting in wounded men and women choosing life instead of suicide. We are grateful for those who befriend those calling out for someone to Stand-by-me!

More than 22 Veterans each day take their lives because their order of priorities are skewed. FSCs have befriended many and saved lives simply by being a friend. Our FSCs include, but are not limited to, NCOs and officers, counselors, psychologists, nurses, as well as civilians.

These individuals volunteer 10 hours a month engaging and offering support to Veterans and First Responders who are struggling with the invisible scars of wars and traumas, domestic challenges, crime. FSCs speak 1:1 with our heroes and recognize and empathize with their inner battles. Our stabilizing priorities focus, without exception, on God first, then family, country and others. We begin with the most important truth: our mission is to be fruitful and multiply. To those struggling we become one who sticks closer than a friend: One string alone can be pulled apart but multiple strings are not easily separated.
